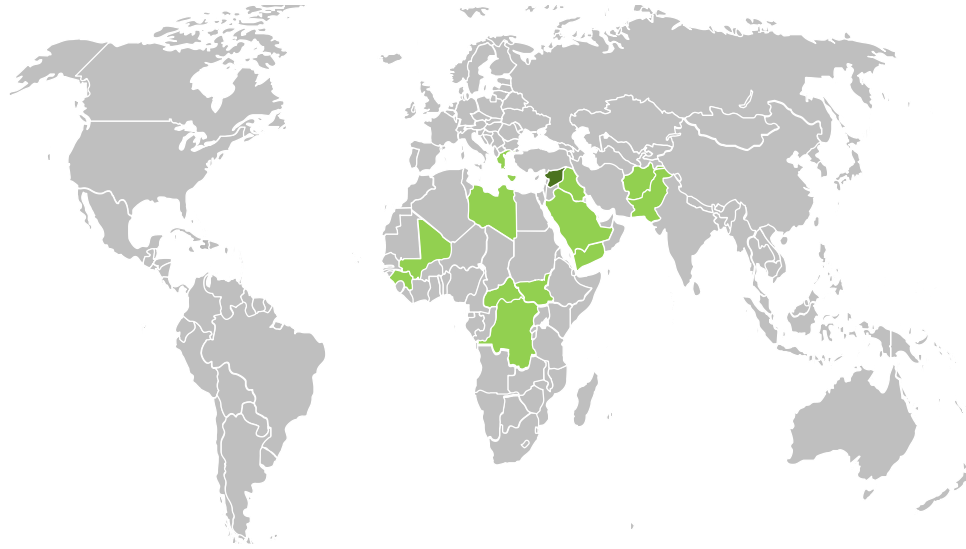


During the first six months of 2017, open-source monitoring identified 18 health facilities reportedly destroyed and 30 reportedly damaged in five countries.

In 2016, 68 health facilities were reportedly destroyed and 100 damaged in 11 countries. In 2015, three health facilities were reportedly destroyed and 17 damaged in five countries. This data is based on incidents identified by Insecurity Insight's monitoring of open sources using the Security in Numbers Database (SiND).

Number of health facilities reportedly damaged or destroyed, January 2015 - June 2017:

- 1** CAR, Greece, Guinea, Mali, Saudi Arabia

86% of affected health facilities were damaged or destroyed by **explosive weapons**: Syria (187), Yemen (8), Afghanistan, Iraq/KRI, Libya, Pakistan (2 each).
